Learning Those Times Tables!

Learning the times tables is a key part of maths — it helps children throughout different maths lessons, being able to problem-solve in different contexts. Recalling your tables quickly is our overall aim for children. However, it is also important to teach them the links between tables — and being able to use one table to derive other number facts from it.

Therefore we have two different approaches in school. Our Number Links boards are used to secure understanding and the ability to derive number facts. These are really fantastic! Many parents have purchased these from us – to play the games at home. If you haven't got one yet, they are available from the school office.

We have also recently introduced our Times Tables Rock Stars – an online resource. Your child has an individual log-in, and their own personal 'rock star' name on here – this is great for practising recall.

The BASE

The BASE is open from 7.30am each morning for breakfast sessions. We also have increased places in the evening sessions this term.
