

The children will be studying how the author has used metaphor and themes of friendship to make the audience empathise with the characters. This will lead to the children writing their own adventure narrative with an alternative natural disaster setting and their own characters. Our guided reading sessions will focus on a range of non-fiction and fiction texts that are all about natural disasters.						
Maths		The children will begin by recapping time and deepening their understanding through problem solving using time duration and time intervals. This will then lead on to the children interpreting graphs and applying their time knowledge to line and time graphs later on in the term. The children will then learn about negative numbers and roman numerals. We will then be moving on to another area of measure, where we will be looking at money. We will use our knowledge or place value and the four operations to calculate and solve word problems involving money, including solving problems with answers up to 2 decimal places.
