
Year 5 Ancient Greece



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English			This half term the children will be looking at engaging and interesting Greek Myths. For instance, they will learn how Theseus slayed the Minotaur and other excellent stories. We will be writing our own Greek Myth based on Theseus and the Minotaur. Then, in keeping with the theatrical traditions of Ancient Greece, we will move on to writing a playscript based on Pandora's Box. Our guided reading will focus on a range of texts about Ancient Greek life and Greek myths.				
Maths			As we begin our journey into the year 5 maths curriculum, we will spend the weeks recalling and deepening our understanding of key year 4. We will be exploring place value including decimal numbers. We will also be familiarising ourselves with written methods and looking at larger numbers up to 7 digits. We will then move on to multiplication and division. Focussing on factors and multiples. We will be using procedural and conceptual variation to help become masters at mathematics and applying our knowledge to solve a range of problems.
