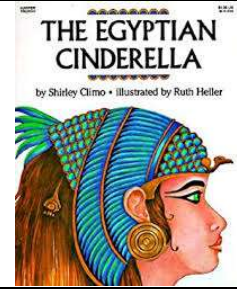

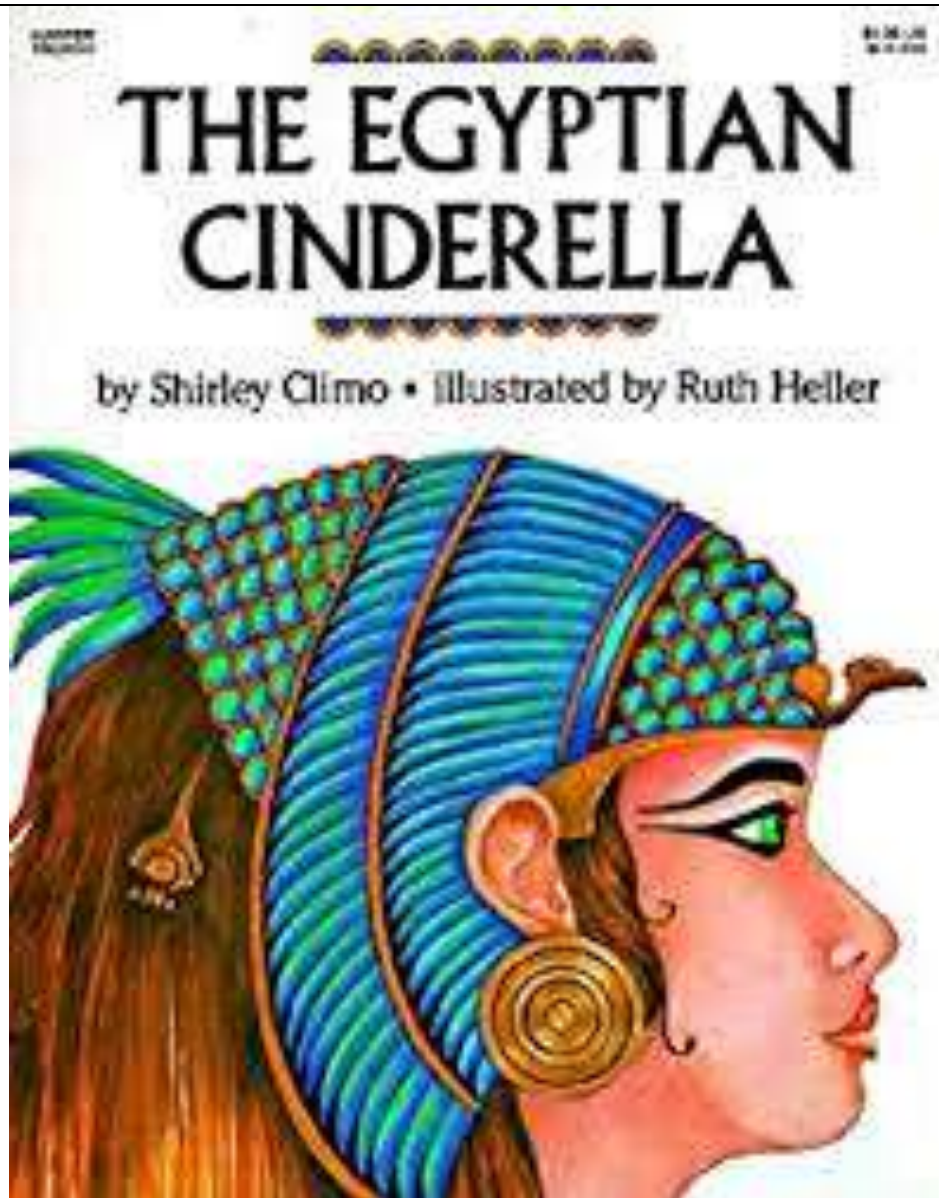
Ancient Egyptians



<p>English</p>	<p>This term the children will be studying the text The Egyptian Cinderella. We will be using this text to create our own narratives based on a traditional tale with a historical twist. The book will be used to develop children's own characters and setting descriptions.</p> <p>Following this we will be creating an instruction text on how to mummify a human body using the children's subject knowledge of mummification from our Egyptian topic.</p> <p>Our guided reading sessions will focus on non-fiction texts about aspects of Egyptian life.</p>				
<p>Maths</p>	<p>In maths we will be exploring place value. We will be looking at written methods for addition, subtraction, multiplication and division as well as focussing on our number facts and times tables.</p> <p>We will be using procedural and conceptual variation to help become masters at mathematics.</p>				
<p>Science, Geography and History</p>	<p>Science Electricity</p> <p>Key Questions: What is electricity? How do we use electricity? How does electricity get from A to B? What is a circuit? How does a bulb light up? What will electricity look like in the future?</p>		<p>History / Geography Ancient Egypt</p> <p>Key Questions: How can we discover what Ancient Egypt was like over 5,000 years ago? Why was the Nile so important? What sources of evidence have survived and how were they discovered? What secrets of Ancient Egypt are revealed by the pyramids? What did the Ancient Egyptians believe about life after death and how do we know? What did Ancient Egypt have in common with other civilizations from that time?</p>		
	<p>Art and DT Egyptian Masks We will design and make an Egyptian mask using papier-mâché.</p>	<p>Technology Electricity We will begin to investigate electrical circuits in products.</p>	<p>Computing Creating a Game We will be programming. They will be using Scratch to create games.</p>	<p>PE OAA and Pilates We will be using their skills of teamwork with orienteering. They will also be undertaking lessons in pilates.</p>
